There is much being made these days by some Christians about the Israel-Hamas-Hezbollah-Iran war as being a signal of "the end time" (Jude 18 HCSB). However, the Bible indicates that "old covenant" (2 Corinthians 3:14) with "Israel according to the flesh" (1 Corinthians 6:18 NKJV) was "cancelled" (Ephesians 2:14 NLT), and "replaced" (2 Corinthians 3:11 NLT) by his "new covenant" (Hebrews 9:15) with the Christian "Israel of God" (Galatians 6:15,16 NIV), which has Jesus Christ as its "high priest" and "mediator" (Hebrews 9:11,15). Indeed, according to the scriptures, "the kingdom of God" was "taken away from" fleshly Israel, "and given to a people, producing the fruit of it" (Matthew 21:43 NASB), that is, to Christians in the "new covenant" (2 Corinthians 3:6).

This means that modern Israel does not fulfill Bible prophecy. How about Old Testament restoration prophecies concerning "Israel," (Ezekiel 37), and prophecies about "Jerusalem" defeating its enemies (Zechariah 12)? "Israel" (Revelation 7:1-8) represents the "vast crowd too great to count, from every nation and tribe and people and language," who are Christians led by "the Lamb," Jesus Christ (Revelation 7:9-15 NLT). "Jerusalem" represents "the heavenly Jerusalem" (Hebrews 12:22), "the Jerusalem above" (Galatians 4:26) that Christians have "approached," and live under, not earthly Jerusalem.

Nevertheless, how about a "sign" that the end is near? That is not going to happen, because, as Jesus told the people of his day: "A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a sign! But no sign will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah" (Matthew 12:39 NIV). The same is true today!

The "sign" that Jesus' apostles asked for will not be seen until the very end, when "the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky" (Matthew 24:3,30 NASB). At that future time when Jesus comes unexpectedly (Matthew 24:36,42,44; Revelation 16:15), everyone on earth will know it (Matthew 24:27).

So, no, war with Israel does not signal the end is near. Jesus said that "wars" (Matthew 24:6-8; Luke 21:9) would be business as usual for this world until the end. Jesus even warned that "many will come in my name . . . saying, 'The time has come!' But don't believe them" (Luke 21:8 NLT). Modern day Israel does not fulfill Bible prophecy!

What we should keep uppermost in mind is that we "must be ready all the time, for the Son of Man will come when least expected" (Matthew 24:44 NLT).
