



Trinitarianism asserts that Jesus Christ is a “God-man”. However, promoting this “God-man” is actually “antichrist”. How so? Notice:

“God-man (Koinē Greek: θεάνθρωπος, romanized: theánthropos; Latin: deus homo is a term which refers to the *incarnation* and the *hypostatic union* of Christ, which are two of mainstream Christianity’s most widely accepted and revered *christological* doctrines. The first usage of the term “God-man” as a theological concept appears in the writing of the 3rd-century Church Father Origen: ‘This substance of a soul, then, being intermediate between God and the flesh – it being impossible for the nature of God to intermingle with a body without an intermediate instrument – the God-man is born.’” — Wikipedia

The Christian apostle John, late in the 1st century, was inspired by God (2 Timothy 3:16) to warn that anyone who teaches that Jesus Christ came to earth as anything other than 100% **“fully human in every way” (Hebrews 2:17 NIV)** human being, is not only teaching a false doctrine, spreading “the spirit of the antichrist”, but is actually **“an antichrist”** himself. This is exactly what Trinitarians do with their “God-man”, that is, their Jesus whose body is an *“an intermediate instrument.”* This scripture-defying monstrosity is diametrically opposed by the apostle John’s inspired words:

“Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the spirit of the antichrist, of which you have heard that it is coming; and now it is already in the world”—1 John 4:2,3 NASB

“Every spirit” here **obviously** is talking about any and all people who deny Jesus, so **“many”** are included here as being **“antichrists.” (1 John 2:18)** John here also refers to **“the spirit of the antichrist,”** which may refer to all individual antichrists as one collective, or composite, **“antichrist.”** They deny **“that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh.”** Trinitarians do this with their “fully God, fully man” “God-man” dogma.

“Many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh. The is a deceiver and an antichrist”—2 John 7 NKJV

Notice that the scripture says, each one of the **“many deceivers”** is **“an antichrist.”** Or, in other words, **“Any such person is . . . the antichrist” (2 John 7 NIV)**. Clearly, this points to many different people all throughout the centuries as being **“an antichrist,”** or **“the antichrist.”** Denial of Jesus as the Christ, and as the Son of God, of necessity, includes denial of any or all of the scriptural **“teaching” (John 8:31; 14:23; 2 John 9,10)** by, or about, Jesus. These would be things like his **“origin” (Micah 5:2 NRSV; NAB; CSB)**, his position **“at the right hand of God” (Acts 2:33; 7:56; Romans 8:34; Colossians 3:1; Hebrews 1:3; 10:12)**, his fulfillment of hundreds of Old Testament prophecies as God’s Messiah **(Luke 24:44)**, his positions as God’s **“High Priest” (Hebrews 4:14 NLT; NKJV)** and **“King” (Matthew 25:34,40 NKJV; NLT)**.

In no way is Jesus Christ “fully God”. That would be impossible, because he said, **“God sent me” (John 8:42 NIV)**, and **“I came from God” (John 16:27 NAB)**. In this article, we’ve seen how the scriptures prove that anyone promoting the Trinitarian “God-man” is “antichrist”.
